Democrat Establishment Opposes Extreme Late-Term Abortions Being Pushed in Ohio's Issue 1

ESTABLISHMENT DEMOCRATS ARE AGAINST LATE-TERM ABORTIONS

- Joe Biden <u>opposed</u> late-term abortions.
- Democrat Senator Joe Manchin <u>voted to end late-term abortions</u> at the point where an unborn child can feel pain, and he supported a measure to <u>protect</u> babies born alive after botched abortions.
- During his Ohio Senate campaign last year, Democrat Tim Ryan supported restrictions on late-term abortions, calling the procedures "an absolute tragedy."
- Louisiana Governor John Bel Edwards signed the state's heartbeat bill into law.
 - o A number of Democrat legislators backed the bill in Louisiana.
- In recent years, more than <u>140 Democrat state legislators</u> have voted in favor of limits on abortion.
- The national group Democrats for Life opposes late-term abortions, calling on Congress and state legislatures to pass pregnancy support measures, "rather than pushing for unregulated abortion at any stage of pregnancy."

AMERICANS OPPOSE LATE-TERM ABORTIONS

- Ohio's Issue 1 is grossly out of line with the beliefs of the American people.
 - Most Americans believe that <u>abortion should be illegal in the second and</u> <u>third trimesters</u> of pregnancy.
 - o A <u>majority of rank-and-file Democrats</u> support limiting abortion by no later than 15 weeks.

DEMOCRAT OPPOSITION TO LATE-TERM ABORTIONS IN MICHIGAN PREVIEWS FALLOUT FROM OHIO'S ISSUE 1

 After a similar constitutional amendment to Ohio's Issue 1 passed in Michigan last year, there is <u>Democrat opposition to a package of bills</u> that will remove limits on abortion.

Establishment Democrats oppose the extreme late-term abortions allowed under Issue 1. If Issue 1 passes, painful late-term abortions after the unborn baby can feel pain will be permitted in Ohio, making the state one of the most extreme in the country for abortion.
